Dear Parents and Carers,

Welcome back to of all our Woodside children and their families. It has been wonderful to see the school full of curious children who seem rested and ready to learn. We have a great autumn curriculum planned to ease the children back into school life and to reignite their love of learning.

Please find below some useful information related to your child's learning and how you can support your child at home.

Communication

Please use Class Dojo to contact your child's teacher. This is an efficient way to discuss any queries, concerns or to simply to pass on some information directly with the class teacher. If you have not yet accepted the invitation to join this form of communication, please contact the class teacher directly. Any absence or the notification of an upcoming appointment should be sent to the school Office as usual.

Timetable

You will be able to find the year group's general week timetable on the class page of our school website.

Reading

All children have been shown and may have already started using the online reading record – '**Go Read'** to record their weekly reading. We are currently waiting to update this and Mrs Jonwood will shortly be contacting you with further details.

Please fill in the reading record a minimum of 3 times a week to confirm that your child has read. Questioning your child about what they have read will greatly assist the development of their comprehension skills. Teachers or support staff will reward children each Monday for their reading efforts.

School Library

All children will have the opportunity to choose a library book if they would like one when we visit the library. They will then have access to library club when they can change their book when they are ready. Each class will also have one session in the library per half term and learn how the use the library to enhance their learning.

Homework

All homework tasks are set on a Monday (unless there is no school on Monday when they will be set on Tuesday) and returned by the following Monday. The login details remain the same as last year.

Details of the weekly tasks are explained below:















Google Classroom – An assignment will be set each week which will be linked to a curriculum area we are studying. The curriculum area will vary from week to week. The task is set on Google Classroom and should be 'turned in' on Google Classroom either as a digital piece of work or a photo of a handwritten piece, model or drawing. Tasks are often creative in nature and some tasks may be set to span more than one week to allow more time for completion.

MyMaths – There will be a mymaths task most weeks. These will be linked to the topic being studied in maths and at a suitable level for each child. Children should be encouraged to use a pencil and paper to support written calculations as needed.

Spelling/Phonics – Your child will bring home a spelling task to complete each week. This should be completed in their spelling book, in pencil, and returned to school each week. We ask that the spelling words are written in sentences so that they understand the meaning as well as practicing the spelling pattern. We will aim to identify any children which may need a different spelling task as soon as we can.

PE Kit

All children are to come to school in their full winter P.E. kit including trainers, on the days they have a PE lesson – **Mondays and Thursdays**. PE kit is as follows; green PE t-shirt, jumper and joggers. Joggers may be bottle green or black. Trainers should be plain, simple and comfortable for running. Your child will have **to have their shorts underneath their joggers for the indoor P.E. lesson on the Monday.**

PLEASE ENSURE ALL KIT IS NAMED WITH PERMANENT MARKER, INCLUDING TRAINERS.

Important dates

We have a Benchball Festival, competing against other local schools, at Amersham School scheduled on Monday 21st November. We will be grateful to any parent volunteers who can help walk with us leaving approximately 1.10pm and /or walking back to school leaving Amersham School at 3.00pm. You do not have to stay.

On Tuesday 27th September, we will be having an 'Italy Day' where we be learning about the physical and human features of Italy and the culture. We would like the children to wear something simple such as Italian flag colours (red, white and green).

Year 4 will be performing the Christmas play this December. There will be more details about this after half term.

Water bottles and Fruit Snacks

Please make sure that your child brings a named, filled water bottle and fruit snack every day. Please avoid sending in a new bottle of water in plastic bottles. Please use reusable bottles.

We are sure you will appreciate that this is not an exhaustive list and these details are subject to change as we respond to the needs of the class.

Parental support at home is a key factor in children's progress and we look forward to working with you this term.

We would like to offer parents and opportunity to volunteer in class, subject to having a full DBS check.
