A word from Mrs Milner

Dear Parents and Carers,

Welcome back! It has been such a pleasure to welcome all the children back to our school after a six-week break. I cannot believe that we are already almost one week into our new term. Time just flies by so quickly. I sincerely hope that the children had a good summer, with plenty of fun and rest. They must now be more than ready to embrace their new academic year. Although it was so lovely to spent time in the garden and tending to my flower beds, I was more than ready to return to work. I missed the children and all the excitement that is part of any school day. So here we are -today is day four and it seems that summer has not happened at all....

First, please accept our sincere apologies for IT issues. Woodside had a new IT system installed during the summer, as part of a general upgrade of our systems. Unfortunately, there were some 'teething' problems, which were beyond our control. Staff update – we welcome Mrs Hosseini, who will be working with our strong team of Midday Supervisors. We also welcome back Miss Revel who will be working as a Midday Supervisor and in our afterschool club. Miss Terebas will be returning from her maternity leave on Monday 12th September.

We are also welcoming Mr Smith, our SCITT student, who will be working with Mrs Drake in Year 6. This school prides itself on training future teachers and, as you know, out current three members of staff trained with us -Mr Ahmed, Mr Harvey-Mott and Miss Croot.

I would like to share my thoughts with you regarding children's attendance. The Government issued an updated guidance to all schools, in place from September 2022. The guidance clearly states that children's attendance at school is everyone's responsibility and that parents have a legal duty to ensure that their child receives education either by attendance or by education otherwise than a school. Where parents decide to have their child registered at school, they have an additional legal duty to ensure their child attends that school regularly. This means their child must attend every day that the school is open, except in a small number of allowable circumstances such as being too ill to attend or being given permission for an absence in advance from the school. We will, therefore, monitor your child's attendance regularly and contact you, in the first instance, if we have concerns regarding your absence. Term time holidays will not be authorised. I sincerely hope that by forming a strong partnership between the school and parents, we will all ensure that children's attendance remains one of the most important priorities for the school as well as parents. Although, COVID hopefully is behind us, we are still reminded of the time and learning lost due to the pandemic. It is, therefore, paramount that all children have the utmost opportunity to attend the school regularly and not compromise their learning even further.

Thank you very much for respecting our request regarding appropriate school uniform and shoes. It so lovely to see the children looking smart and ready to learn. Can I please remind all the parents and carers that if your child has long hair, it ought to be tied back. Thank you again for your cooperation.

Can I please politely remind you regarding considerate parking. Please do not park across driveways of our neighbours' houses. Every year we have some complaints from members of our immediate community regarding cars parked inconsiderately. As always – many thanks for your understanding and cooperation. Much appreciated.

We now hope that your parental/carer Bromcom—My Child At School (MCAS) accounts have been activated. If you re experiencing difficulties or not sure how to activate your account – please let us know as all 'school to parent' communication will be conducted via MCAS.

The current cost of living crisis will affect us all, but the impact will be disproportionately felt by those who are already struggling to make ends meet. Many families across the country are suffering in silence, as they perhaps feel embarrassed and uncomfortable to talk about their private hardship. Please be assured that our school will always be non-judgemental. I hope that you agree we are friendly and approachable. Please come and chat to us, if you are experiencing a real hardship. We may point you towards the organisations who can help and, on our part, we will try to support you as much as possible and within our means. I still have my 'Open Fridays' so please make use of the time -if necessary. With this in mind, please click here for the Free School Meal application form. Paper copies are available from the office. Please do this if you believe you may be eligible. Our staff is also currently reviewing all our school trips to ensure that costs are kept to minimum. The PTA will be running the second-hand uniform for your child. Equally if you have any uniform that you no longer need, please donate it to the school (via the school office).

Safeguarding

I will continue to provide you with regular updated regarding safeguarding of our pupils. I sincerely hope that you find all the information useful and not too alarmist. Schools plays a very important role in ensuring that pupils are safeguarded against any possible harm. Online safety remains one of the biggest safeguarding risks to our children.

I would like to list some of the possible dangers that you ned to be aware of:

- Child-on-child abuse also known as a form of 'cyberbullying', the harmful online behaviours some children experience, may take on new and unexpected forms, with new platforms, features, and technology.
- Misinformation conspiracies and "fake news". With more platforms taking on the 'TikTok style' short form video, visual misinformation is easier to consume with fewer fact checks and sources.
- Scams –Last year saw an increase in financial scams on chat platforms like WhatsApp, which is expected to continue this year.
- Sexual Exploitation Since the start of the global pandemic, there has been an exponential rise in child sexual exploitation and abuse online. Last year the IWF warned that nearly half (44%) of the imagery it acted on was 'self-generated'. Influencers With social media platforms accounting for 43.5% of where internet users do brand research many companies are turning to Influencers to help them market products, especially to younger consumers.

Please continue speaking to your child and we, as a school, continue to teach the children about responsible internet use. We will be organising E-safety workshop for parents and carers soon.
