
## Mrs Harrison's Weekly Curriculum Update continued...










Ages 5-8 All My Stripes: A Story for Children with Autism (Shaina Rudolph and Danielle Royer, 2015; Magination Press)




Ages 6 and UpThe Autism Acceptance Book (EllenSabin, 2006: Pathway Book Service, 2006)






Ages 8 and up "Car Wash Wish" (Sita Brahmachari)
