


A note from Mrs Tandara...

Oxford Diocesan Bucks Schools Trust guidance for education settings regarding Coronavirus



At ODBST schools, we follow the NHS guidance with regards to Covid 19. Since March 2022, when the final Covid restrictions were lifted, the UK Health and Security Agency (UKHSA) has advised that COVID-19 should be managed like other respiratory infections, such as flu.

COVID-19 presents a low risk to children and young people. This, combined with high vaccination rates in the population, means there are no longer specific rules relating to COVID-19 in schools, colleges, childcare and other education settings. The guidance below is taken from the NHS and government websites to produce guidance for schools.

What to do if a pupil has symptoms of covid 19:

As individuals are now mixing regularly and there are no covid restrictions, regular testing is no longer as effective as it once was, it is therefore, no longer required to take a lateral flow test if you have symptoms of covid 19 unless you are clinically vulnerable.

Those who are eligible for treatments if they were to catch covid-19 should still take a lateral flow test as soon as possible and get in touch with their health care provider for assistance if they test positive.

For everyone else, you should be able to look after yourself at home if you have symptoms. The NHS advises that you should try to stay home and avoid contact with other people if you or your child have symptoms and either:

- Have a high temperature.
- Do not feel well enough to go to work, school, childcare or do normal activities.

You can return to normal activities once you feel well enough or you no longer have a temperature.

What to do if a pupil tests positive for COVID-19:

The NHS advises that you are no longer required to do a lateral flow test if you have symptoms, however if you have tested positive, you should:

- Pupils under the age of 18 should try to stay at home and avoid contact with other people for 3 days after the day they took the test.
- Avoid meeting people who are more likely to get seriously ill from viruses, for 10 days after testing positive.
- If the pupil is clinically vulnerable, and eligible for treatments, they should contact their health care provider.

To enable schools to protect vulnerable staff and children, it is recommended that parents inform the school that their child has tested positive, so that arrangements can be made to protect vulnerable staff and students for the remaining 7 days after their return.
