Please see the letter below from Dr Diane Davies, an archaeologist who specialises in the Ancient Maya time period...

Dear Mr Harvey-Mott,

Thank you so much for the letters from your class. They took a while to arrive as I now live on the tip of North Wales!

I agree with Tilly and Ollie that drought was the cause of the abandonment of Maya cities in the rainforest.

The analysis of lake sediment cores from Lake Chichancanab in the Yucatán Peninsula has confirmed that during this time period there was an extensive drought that lasted decades. The central area of the lowlands was a closed basin, with swamps and shallow lakes. The water supply was seasonal, which necessitated the construction of reservoirs or *bajos* (seasonal swamps) in order to have water throughout the year. The drought then resulted in cities being abandoned and people migrating to areas where access to water was more plentiful.
