Dear Parents / Carers,

On Monday we celebrated International Mother Language Day. International Mother Language Day is observed every year to promote multilingualism. At the last count, there are twenty-two (including English) languages spoken at our school. This is remarkable and I am very proud of such a diverse community. On Monday children participated in an assembly celebrating linguistic diversity.

The 27th of January is the United Nations General Assembly designated International Holocaust Remembrance Day – an anniversary of the liberation of Auschwitz -Birkenau concentration camp. On this annual day of commemoration, the UN urges every member state to honour six million Jewish victims of the Holocaust as well as millions of other victims of Nazism. All over the world, Auschwitz has become a symbol of terror and genocide. The camp was established by the Nazis in 1940, in the suburbs of Oswiecim, a Polish city. Auschwitz became the largest of the extermination centres, where the Nazi plan to murder European Jews, Poles, Romas and other groups was carried out. I was privileged enough to visit, what is now, a museum and was humbled by the experience. Auschwitz Birkenau serves as a terrifying reminder of the worst crimes in humankind's history, but more importantly, it is an ongoing memento for the millions of people that lost their lives in the Nazi concentration camps.

It is difficult to follow such a poignant paragraph. Weather has been playing tricks this month -frosty one day and then warmer the next! Thank you for ensuring that children are wearing warm coats. I would also like to say thank you as most of our pupils are wearing correct uniform as well as PE kits. I found this poem that to me sums January's weather. Spring is almost around the corner, and I am so looking forward to some sunshine and lighter mornings/ evenings in weeks to come.

For Parents - Fortnite Parental Controls

I know that Fortnite is popular with many children. Can I politely remind you that this game is aimed at children aged 12 and over, therefore it should not be played by anyone younger. Age restrictions are there for a reason. However, to minimise the risk, if parents choose to allow their child/children to play the game, please have a look at the parental controls.

Fortnite Chapter 4 has just been released, which means that many children are going to be talking about this. Similarly, some children who grew bored with Chapter 3 are going to be checking out the new Chapter 4. So now is a good time for parents to revisit those parental controls to set up the game and devices appropriately to the age of the child. FREE Courses For Young People Delivered by the Family Support Service

The FSS are very pleased to let you know we will be running three exciting projects online and in person for young people in years 7 and upwards starting in February 2023. Each course is for six weeks and commence the week beginning 20 February 2023. The closing date for referrals is 6 February. We have courses on:

• How to Build Positive relationships: Online. This course is for young people who struggle with relationships in different aspects which could include with friends or families. It aims to give general strategies for dealing with relationships indifferent contexts including online.

• How to deal with Stress, anxiety & low mood: High Wycombe and Online. This course aims to help young people name, express and normalise emotions, explore techniques for managing them and explore the relationship between thoughts, feelings and actions.

• How to Build Confidence and self-esteem: Steeple Claydon, Beaconsfield and Virtual. This course aims to give young people the space to explore what makes them special and unique by giving them practical strategies to increase their confidence and self-esteem including self-awareness, identity and dealing with setbacks. We also offer drop-ins for young people and families to pop in and get help, advice and guidance. These run Monday-Friday 9am-5pm.
