
Woodside Summer Term Clubs

There are currently a limited number of spaces available for group ukulele tuition for pupils at your child's school (existing students please disregard).

KEY INFORMATION

Lessons take place on a set day/time of the week at each school. We will confirm prior to the lessons beginning, which day they will take place at your child's school.

Lessons are 30 minutes long and take place either during the school day, or afterschool.

Lessons are ongoing throughout the school year. Each group usually contains between 3-6 students.

Lessons are £6.25 per student, and fees are invoiced on a half termly (5-7 weeks) basis.

Students can borrow a ukulele in school for their lesson, but we advise they purchase their own instrument at some point so they are able to practice at home.
